NO TO RACISM! NO TO FASCISM!

'NO PASARAN -THEY SHALL NOT PASS!'

On Sunday October 4, 1936, more than 100,000 people gathered in the East End, blockading Gardiners Corner at Aldgate and building barricades in Cable Street, to oppose antisemitism and fascism.

They blocked the path of Sir Oswald Mosley's British Union of Fascists (the 'Blackshirts').

Local people – especially the Irish and Jewish communities that Mosley tried to divide against each other – united to say: 'They shall not pass', echoing the call against fascism in Spain: 'No Pasaran!'.

Workers, the unemployed, socialists and communists came from across London and from other parts of Britain to help stop the Blackshirts marching down Cable Street.

Although thousands of police tried clear the way for the fascists, they were beaten back by East Enders and their supporters of all ethnic groups and backgrounds. For more: http://www.cablestreet.uk/
